ORDER OF EXTENSION FOR DISASTER DECLARATION RELATED TO RISK OF WILDFIRES

WHEREAS, Freestone County has not had a significant rainfall for an extended period of time, creating hot and dry conditions which poses the threat of large, dangerous, and fast-moving wildfires; which have the potential of endangering lives and damaging property on a large scale.

WHEREAS, on July 19, 2022, a Disaster Declaration Related to Risk of Wildfires was declared, signed by the County Judge, and filed with the County Clerk in accordance to Texas Government Code Chapter 418.108.

WHEREAS, a local disaster declaration expires seven (7) days after it is issued, unless commissioners court consents to its continuance or renewal as stated in the Texas Government Code Chapter 418.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Freestone County that the Disaster Declaration Related to Risk of Wildfires be extended for 90 days from today's date, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier. The County Judge has authorization to cancel the order when it is deemed necessary.


